### R v Bricka [Portsmouth Crown Court] 2023

Multiple Counts Stalking & Perverting the Course of Justice

Olivia Haggar, led by Paul Walker, represented a client charged with ten counts of Stalking and one count of Perverting the Course of Justice. # R v Dr V [GMC & Crown Court] 2019

Sexually Motivated Misconduct

The defendant doctor, having been acquitted of sexual assaults on a patient at the Crown Court (also represented by Sarah Forshaw QC), was to face similar allegations brought by the GMC. Miss Forshaw, assisted by Olivia Haggar, was asked to represent him again at the full contested hearing which lasted 3 weeks. Once again, the complainant and other witnesses were cross-examined. The allegations were all found 'not proved' by the Tribunal. The Doctor has returned to full-time work. Instructed by BCL.
