



Practice Profile

James Brown is a senior junior who combines meticulous preparation with a good manner and sound judgement. He is an extremely effective advocate, on both sides of the courtroom.

James is instructed in long multi-handed trials and other serious cases. The vast majority of his practice is leading junior work. He both prosecutes and defends.

On the prosecution side, James has a strong practice in financial crime. In the recent past he has prosecuted complex immigration frauds, plant machinery frauds, as well as allegations of money laundering and “car ringing.” James has for many years also been instructed to prosecute murders, police corruption (both being led by Queen’s Counsel), attempted murders and other cases of serious violence. These have included the successful prosecution of two attempted murders involving complex psychiatric evidence. James has also prosecuted three manslaughter trials, appearing alone. In other prosecution work, James also frequently leads in “county lines” drugs conspiracies, large scale importations and kidnaps for ransom.

On the defence side, James has a growing practice, particularly in financial crime. He has been instructed by a range of professional clients in the recent past to represent individuals charged with complex money laundering, attempted murder, child abduction, sexual assault, drugs supply and firearms offences and cigarettes importation.

Semi-pro Footballers Jailed for Drug Conspiracy

6 June 2024

Six former semi-professional football players have been jailed for their parts in a conspiracy to supply over 2.7 tonnes of cocaine. The organised criminal gang, headed by Adam Pepera, used encrypted messaging and a network of storage units to supply cocaine worth in excess of £200m. One of the gang members, Luke Skeete, was initially stopped by police in possession of 8 kilos of cocaine. Analysis of his phone, and extensive investigation, led to police uncovering the wider network involved in the enterprise. Pepera received a sentence of 24 years, reduced from 29 years for his guilty plea, with sentences for the others ranging from 13 years to 18 years 9 months.

James Brown, leading Phoebe Bragg, appeared on behalf of the Crown. The case was investigated by the Metropolitan Police's Specialist Crime Unit and prosecuted by the CPS.

Nightclub Murder

11 November 2023

Danny Robinson KC and James Brown prosecuted three defendants for the murder of a man outside a nightclub in Ilford, East London.

After an 8-week trial at the Central Criminal Court, two defendants were convicted of murder and the third was found guilty of manslaughter.

The two defendants were sentenced yesterday to life imprisonment with a minimum term of 25 years. The third defendant will be sentenced on the 22nd November.
